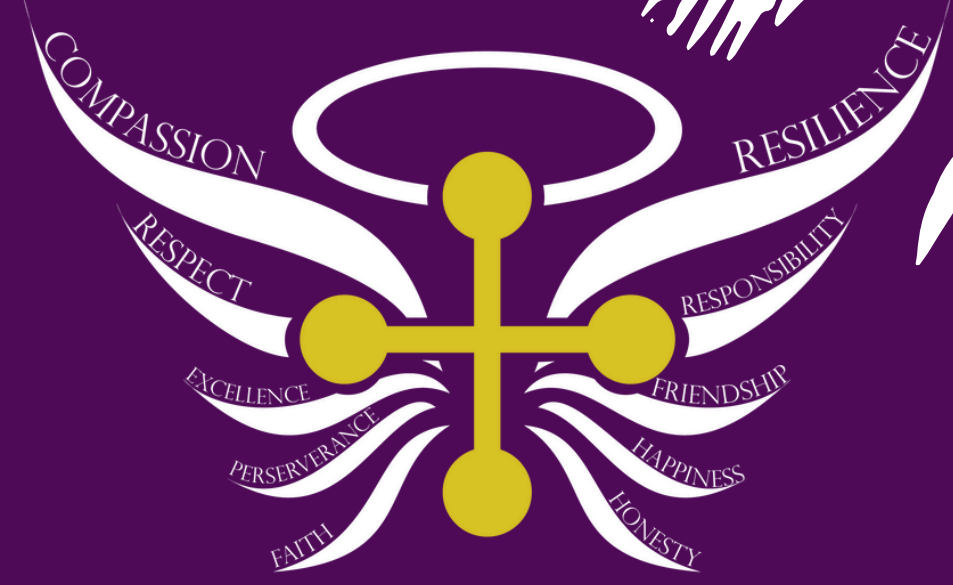

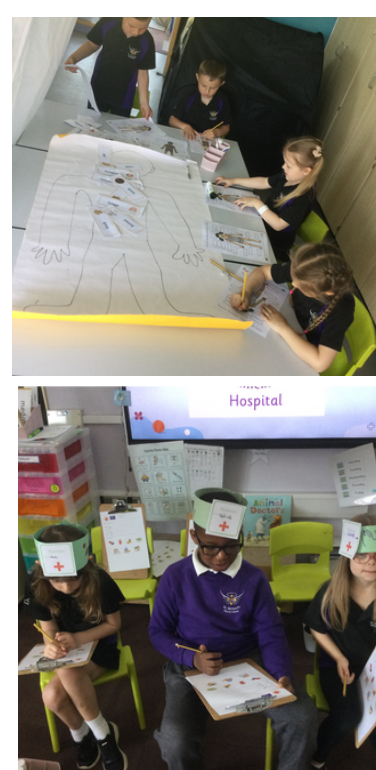
## Call the doctor

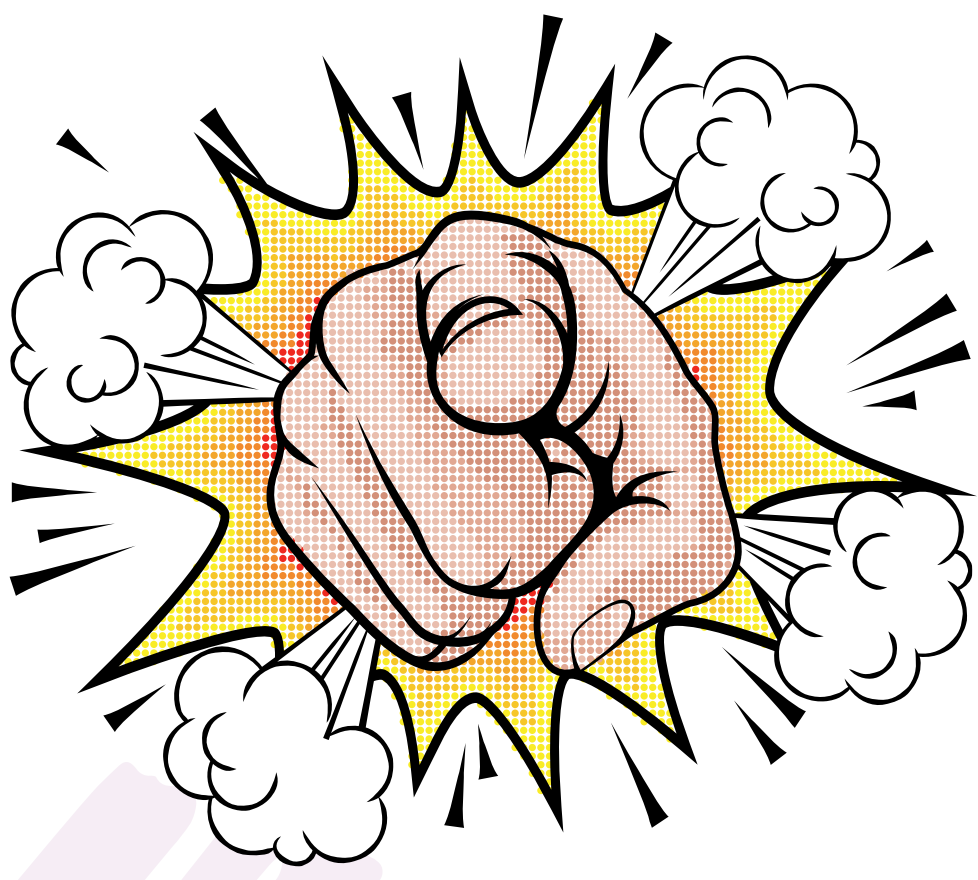

In Science, Year 5 have been continuing their topic on Forces. This week, they have been learning about levers and pulleys Year 5 have carried out an experiment to understand how levers and pulleys help make it easier to move heavy objects.

## Busy Busy Year 2's

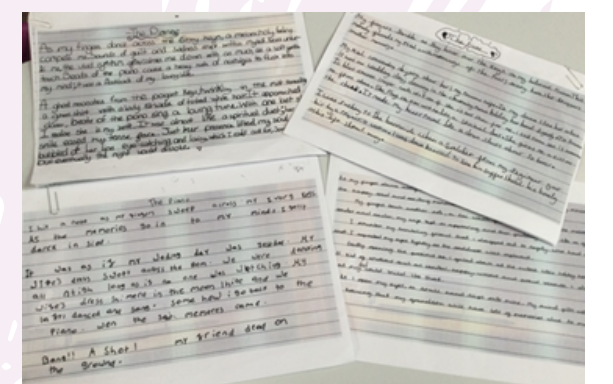


In English this week, Year 2 have been studying the story 'The Tear Thief'. It's about a magical, translucent character who collects children's tears. We worked collaboratively to match coloured tears to different emotions and then ordered them from most valuable to least valuable. We will be using this learning experience to help us plan and write our own report about different types of tears and their values. We are looking forward to finishing our reports and sharing them with our friends in the opposite class.

Our computing lesson this week involved us collecting live data. We created our own tally charts by interviewing our class about their favourite colours. We had to remember that on 5, we 'close the gate'. Next week, we are going to use this information to help us create our own pictograms on the computers.

This week, we began our DT unit, which will roll over to next half term. We will be creating our own healthy, tasty fruit salads. So far, we have researched different types of fruit salads, to help inspire us with planning our own.

In English, we have been writing a narrative with flashbacks. Year 5 looked at a short film 'The Piano' and worked very hard to write their narratives. They focused on changing tenses and including semi colons to join related sentences. We are very proud of the efforts the children put into their writing. Their narratives will be proudly displayed in our shared learning space.



Last week, Year 5 attended the RE Roadshow. The children had an opportunity to learn interesting facts about different faiths. Additionally, they had they enjoyed the chance to dress up in different cultural clothes, which they thoroughly enjoyed.
